## Science

Float or sink. We loved our first experiment in Foundation. Can you try it at home? Have a look for 5 items you can use (ask permission©)

First-Predict what you think will happen - sink X or float. How are you going to record this? We used a chart in school. Can you make one in your book? Then carry out the experiment and see if you were right.

Parents: You can do this as small or large as you prefer! Listen to how they decide whether it will sink or float and ask questions to get them to think a little more about their reasoning.

Can you remember your door number? Put this on the picture. You can also add which street you live in, your town and how many Easter eggs will you need in your home this year ©

Parents: See if they can remember what door number and street they live in before they start the activity.
