Organisation

- * Please inform us via text if children are allowed to walk home or will be picked up by somebody else
- * Children should bring water bottles to school every day - these can be refilled in the classroom
- * They should bring fruit and vegetables as a snack
- * Children should ensure they are wearing appropriate clothing for the weather including proper school shoes (no black trainers). They may need to wear layers as classroom doors and windows are open all day.

Organisation

- * Please could children bring a plastic bag for coats when it is wet (to avoid damaging other items in their locker)
- * Year 5 children will receive a letter about locker keys shortly. When their deposit is handed in, they will receive their key.
- * Mobile phones should be switched off and handed in to the class teacher upon entering the classroom
- * Please encourage children to develop their independence by remembering their own belongings for the day

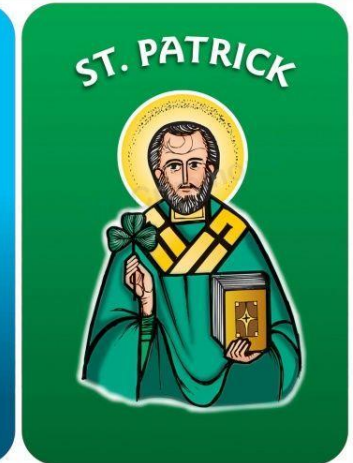
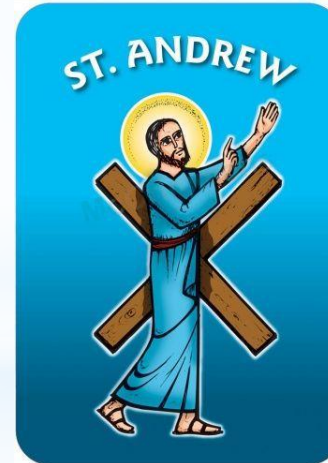
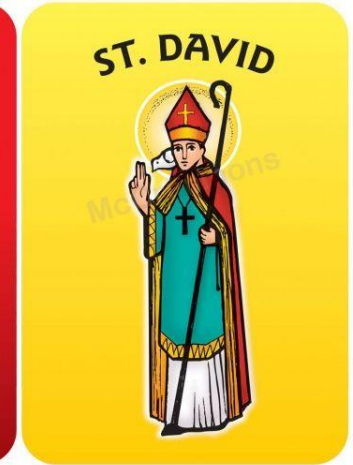
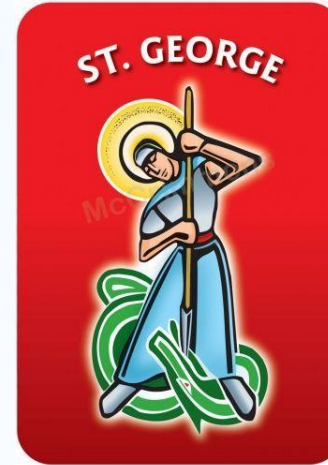
PE
