


English/Literacy Activities

	Make a mind map of your discussion about the book - answer the questions.	Caterpillar). You can scribe for your child if they cannot
		record their own answers - the purpose of the activity is to see how well they have listened and to get them to think more deeply about a story and the author.

Complete the life cycle sheet by either printing, cutting and sticking or drawing your own life cycle into your workbook.


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To use an information text/internet to find facts

Look at the name of the different parts - research them if you don't know what they are, talk about the together and then use the information to label the spider.




Spend time researching - watch videos, read books, ask Alexa questions, ask a family member or friend!

BEFORE YOU READ: What do you think the book is going to be about? What other books have you read by Eric Carle?

DURING THE STORY: Where is the spider? How did she get there? Why is she not answering any of the animals' questions? How do you think the story will end?

AT THE END: What can you remember from the story? Why did the very busy spider spin her web? Have you ever seen a spiders web?




Activity 2 - Order the animals and retell the story

Oh no, the animals have got themselves all in a muddle! Can you remember the order that I met the animals in and what they wanted me to do with them?



























Spider Life Cycle


