tering our school site. Adults who are exempt from wearing a mask must ensure they have their lanyard clearly on view.














The children have enjoyed seeing each others outfits on a virtual parade throughout the day.







Welbeing

Mrs Tolley has visited all classes this week to introduce them to Tapping, which is also known as EFT (Emotional Freedom Technique). EFT can be used to calm the body by simply tapping on our energy hot spots (with hands or fingertips) located on the body or face. Along with mindful breathing, tapping allows the body to shift negative sensations or physical pain and bring balance back to our central nervous system.





The registration for this is now closed and medals have been ordered. Thank you to all the children and staff who have registered for our first marathon in March. We have 85 people registered—good luck to you


Below are some reviews from book club members:

Spotlight on our Curriculum



This week we have enjoyed being in our classes, renewing friendships, exploring the classroom and having a catch up. We are enjoying learning about the number 10 and using the part-whole method to show different ways of doing this.



This week, Year 1 has enjoyed being back together again. There have been lots of smiles and chatter with some work of course. In Maths we recapped some adding, subtracting and measuring skills. In English, we wrote a letter to Mrs Blakeley to let her know what we have enjoyed learning about this term and during lockdown. Our teachers were so impressed with our writing, they put our work up on our Writing Walls.



In Y2 this week we have had a fantastic time settling in and spending time as a class again! We have enjoyed practising rolling a ball in PE, choosing our new reading books from the library and starting our new unit on 2D and 3D shapes in Maths.



In Art, we have been exploring mixing different tones by adding white or black paint. In English, we wrote and illustrated alphabet poems around a theme after reading the poem 'The A-Z of Amazing'. In Maths, we have been measuring and calculating the perimeter of 2d shapes. We have used our knowledge of shape, mental addition and length.



This week in Year 4 we have really enjoyed all being back in class. We have started to look at Fractions in Maths and have started a new book in English called "The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane" by Kate DiCamillo. In Science we have been carrying out experiments to do with sound, we have been using tuning forks and water! We have also had a fantastic Vocabulary Day, we dressed up as some interesting words. Also, this week we have written a poem that will be sent into space!



We have had a busy first week back! In Maths, we have moved on to measuring and drawing angles and we enjoyed holding a mini debate about deforestation in English. In Art, we have been learning about the artist L.S. Lowry and focussing on perspective. On Thursday, we celebrated Vocabulary Day by dressing up and creating our own poem which will be sent in to space and then returned to us! We also joined a live talk given by 'Incredible Oceans' where we learnt about the impact of plastic in the ocean. It has been so lovely to see everyone in real life and we are looking forward to next week!

Signal is a multimedia messaging service (previously known as TextSecure) which provides secure chats between users. It is encrypted, so any intercepted communication cannot be read by attackers. Users can send one-to-one messages or set up group chats. The service is free, has no adverts and doesn't track users' location like many other messaging platforms. The app experienced a popularity boom in early 2021 as large numbers of users left. What LApp over perceived privacy issues.

Disappearing Messages

Mesages on Signal can be set to disappear (from both the sender and the recipient's devices) a specified time offer they are first operad - potentially as little as five seconds. So it is difficult to monitor the app and see what your child is talking about.
