Accelerated reader


We are asking that the children who use Accelerated Reader access the quizzes from home for the moment, in order to minimise the sharing of ipads in school.

Appointments will be available on a Monday afternoon from 2.30 p.m. starting from 28th September, 2020.

If you have a specific query related to your child's class, then please make an appointment to speak to your child's class teacher as they will be best placed to help you. However, if you would appreciate the chance for an informal conversation to explore any other concerns or worries that as parents you may have for your child, this could be a useful session for you.

Your child does not need to have a special educational need identified for you to make an appointment and these sessions are open to any parent who may find them helpful. Mrs Lewis may not have all the answers, but she will be able to make some practical suggestions that will hopefully help you and your child.

Appointments are currently for <u>one parent</u> to attend to enable us to meet with social distancing requirements. Please contact the school office to book a session and they will be able to advise you of the next available appointment.
