## Science

Your objective is to find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching. This is a problem-solving challenge where you make a model from dough by stretching and squashing the material... Think of a favourite book or film character. Perhaps you could choose well-known book characters such as The Gruffalo, The Very Hungry Caterpillar, or the troll from the traditional story Billy Goats Gruff... then make the character out of playdough, Plasticine™ or clay.

Parents: The children would be expected to say when they are stretching and squashing the dough and whether they are using a push or a pull force when stretching or squashing the dough.
