What is a heading?

A heading is the title of a piece of writing, which is usually written at the top of the page.

What is a subheading?

Subheadings are titles that divide part of a piece of writing into shorter sections.

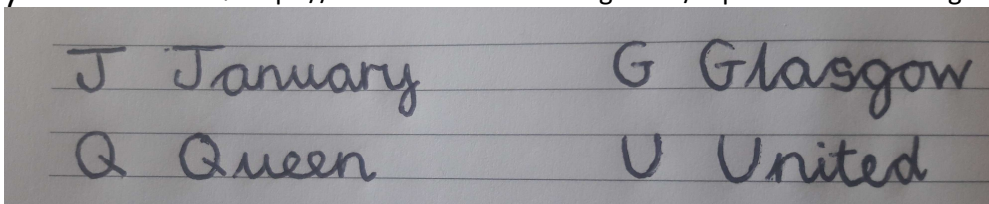
