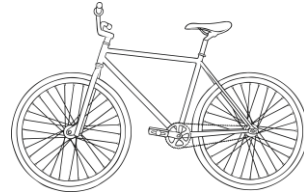


Using Apostrophes to Show Possession

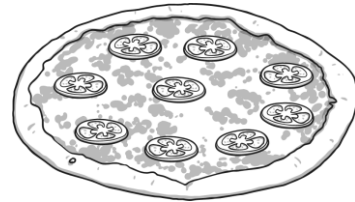
Instructions: Tick the sentence that uses an apostrophe correctly.

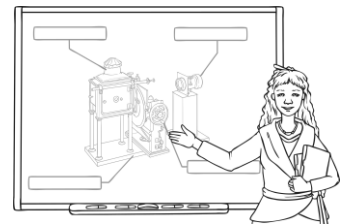
