

Spellings:

Parents: Please test the children on these words before sharing them. (This will give children a score to 'improve' at the end of the week.)

device, devise, advice, advise, stationary, stationery, assent, ascent, compliment, complement

Share the spellings - children to make corrections by rewriting the whole word. They should look up definitions if they are unsure of any meanings.

Ask children to remind you what homophones are and then explain to them what near homophones are. Can they think of anymore words that would fit into this category?

A near homophone is a word which is pronounced almost the same as another word but has a different spelling and meaning. It is not the same as an actual homophone, which is a word that's pronounced the same as another word but has a different spelling and meaning.
