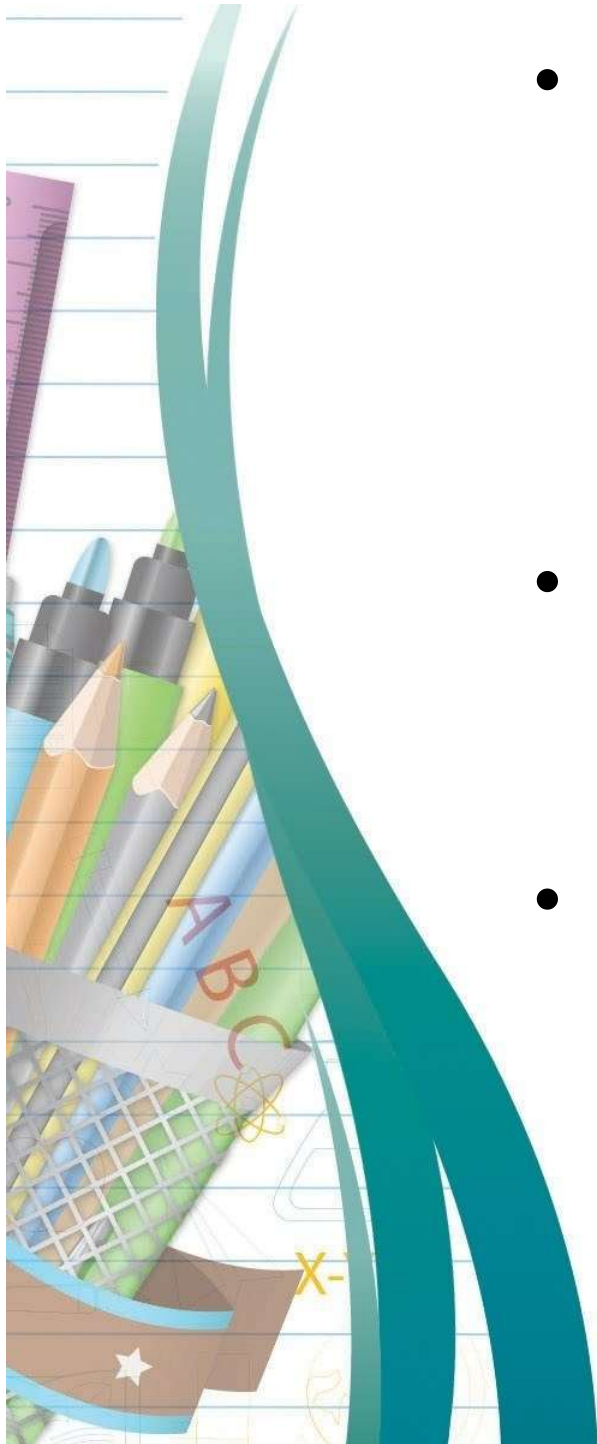
# The School Day

- Children should come to school wearing their P.E kits on their P.E day. Children will wear their kit all day.



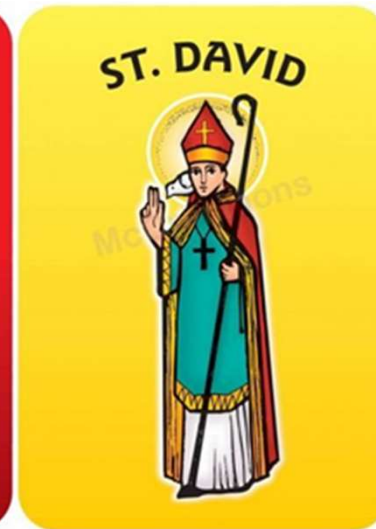
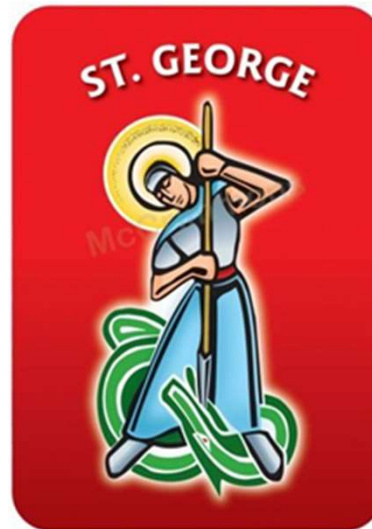
# P.E

# Reading Expectations

- Children must read at home at least three times a week and diaries must be signed by an adult to confirm that they have done so
- Reading diaries should be brought to school every day and will be checked on Fridays.
- If children fail to have their diaries signed for two weeks in a row, they will read in their playtime.



# Homework

- Children should regularly practise times tables on Times Table Rock Stars or other relevant apps as this will aid their basic understanding in all areas of maths.
- We are currently purchasing an online maths, spelling and grammar programme where homework will be set, which children will be able to access from home. Further information will be sent out in due course.

- Don't forget to look at the school website for the latest newsletters. These are also displayed on classroom windows.



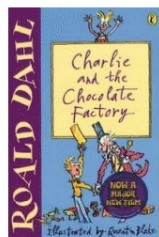
